Only Rain Down The Drain

Do your part to prevent the stench!

Remember the strong odor last August? That was caused by an algae bloom and subsequent fish kill in northern Tampa Bay.



- Do not blow leaves (or anything else) into street or ponds
- Fertilizers and Pesticides Read directions and apply at the minimum recommended rates. Maintain a 10-foot fertilizer-free buffer area from streets and water bodies. Sweep fertilizer from paved areas
- Pick up the Poop
- Pool Maintenance Discharge chlorinated pool water or filter backwash to landscaped areas, never to the street or a water body.

Here come the leaves! Be watchful for the fallen leaves in the streets because when it rains, they all end up in the street gutters and in our stormwater catch basins causing flooding in low lying areas.

Help us keep the water quality in good condition and help prevent flooding in some of our streets by raking up the leaves you see at a catch basin.

Keeping it clean improves your neighborhood, reduces flooding and helps protect our water resources. Adopt a storm drain in your neighborhood.

"According to Pinellas County, the growth of algae...is fueled by nutrients, including those in fertilizers, yard waste, sediment and animal waste. The nutrients are carried into Tampa Bay and other waterways through stormwater runoff...These nutrients also feed algae in our retention ponds, which can cause street flooding due to clogged drains in the ponds. Homeowners can help by adhering to the slogan "Only rain down the drain" and disposing of yard waste, chemicals, and animal waste appropriately." Read full Patch article here.

The City of Safety Harbor's arborist has identified trees in the islands that are in poor health and/or dying.


